

This short documentary follows immigrant families, including a US/Haitian family, trying to settle in Germany but finding that the education system views their children as needing to be streamed into technical, rather than college prep programs, in spite of their German language skills.

#### DON'T TELL ANYONE (NO LE DIGAS A NADIE)—

A PBS/POV documentary following Angy Rivera, an undocumented immigrant who came as a child from South America, and is now living in the US with her also-undocumented mother and younger US-born siblings. Angy decides to "come out" publicly about her status, openly advocate for change to US immigration laws and offer support to other young people like her who fear deportation and family separation.
